Journey of IIC established at the Institute:

IIC was implemented in the College during the 2018–19 academic year as soon as MHRD gave the go-ahead for IIC to begin in higher education institutions. By electing faculty members, business leaders, and students to the IIC council during the academic year 2021–2022, IIC was strengthened. Since its beginning, the IIC has established a presence at the campus, carried out the events outlined in the IIC calendar, and delved into several activities that were entirely self-driven. Faculty members from all departments were added in 2022–2023. Depending on their needs and those of the students, the various departments decided to conductI& E activities.

IIC organized seminars, workshops, quizzes, panel discussions, webinars, motivational presentations, student exhibitions, and competitions to help students to develop their entrepreneurial talents. There are 28 faculty members, 10 innovation ambassadors and 12 student members in the Council.
